Obie Award winner Ntozake Shange and Ifa Bayeza will appear as guest artists at a June 24 event to benefit the mental health organization Community Access. Playwrights Shange and Bayeza, who are sisters, will read from their published and unpublished writings related to family, personal recovery and community healing. The event will take place at Riverside

Church Theatre, beginning with a VIP cocktail reception at 6 PM with the authors and continuing with the readings at 7 PM.

Shange, best known for her Obie-winning and Tony-nominated play "For Colored Girls Who Have Considered Suicide When the Rainbow is Enuf," has also written "A Photograph: Lovers In Motion," "Spell #7," "Boogie-Woogie Landscape," and an Obie-winning adaptation of "Mother Courage and Her Children." She is also a prolific novelist and poet. Bayeza's plays include "The Ballad of Emmett Till," "Amistad Voices," "Club Harlem," "Kid Zero" and "Homer G & The Rhapsodies."
